This is an opportunity to share your neuroethics research with international colleagues who are actively aligning ethics, law, and policy with advances in neuroscience.

Investigators at all career stages are encouraged to submit abstracts for consideration and are eligible to serve as the lead author for up to two abstracts. Acceptance will be based on content, available space, and overall program balance.

The INS is committed to showcasing the talent of diverse presenters and welcomes abstracts related to the field of neuroethics from any disciplinary background.

All submissions must include a concise abstract of 250-400 words in English that satisfies all requirements and composition expectations listed in the online [call for abstracts](#).

You do not need to be an INS member to submit an abstract, but at least one author must be available to present the abstract at the meeting, and must be an INS member before presentation.

SUBMISSION / DEADLINE

All abstracts and required details must be submitted through the [online abstract submission form](#) by the deadline. Incomplete or late submissions will not be accepted.

Submissions must be received by June 26, 2020 at 11:30 p.m. EDT.
